WHAT IS A CORN?	A Corn is skin lesion made up of a concentrated area of hard skin. It typically occurs in
	an area of sustained increased pressure. For example on the joint of a hammer toe or on
WHAT IS A VERRUCA?	the ball for the foot.
WIAI IS A VERKUCA:	A Verruca is a skin lesion caused by a viral infection similar to the warts which can
	occur on hands.
	They can randomly at any site but may be particularly painful in an area of increased
	pressure.
AIMS OF SURGERY	To permanently eliminate the skin lesion. In the case of corns additional surgery may be required to correct deformity a causative deformity (see Bunion, Lesser metatarsal &
	Toe surgery information sheets).
ANAESTHETIC	Regional anesthesia. Local unaesthetic at the knee or ankle to make the limb numb.
	This means you can go home the same day.
